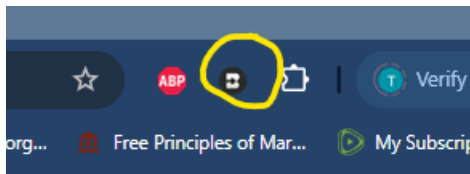


Creating a Quiz from a Website

Find the website with information that you want. I searched for Non-Verbal Communication.

Click on the Chrome Brisk extension icon in the upper right corner. You may have to sign-in at this point.



The Brisk icon will appear at the bottom right of your page. Click it. The Brisk box will appear.

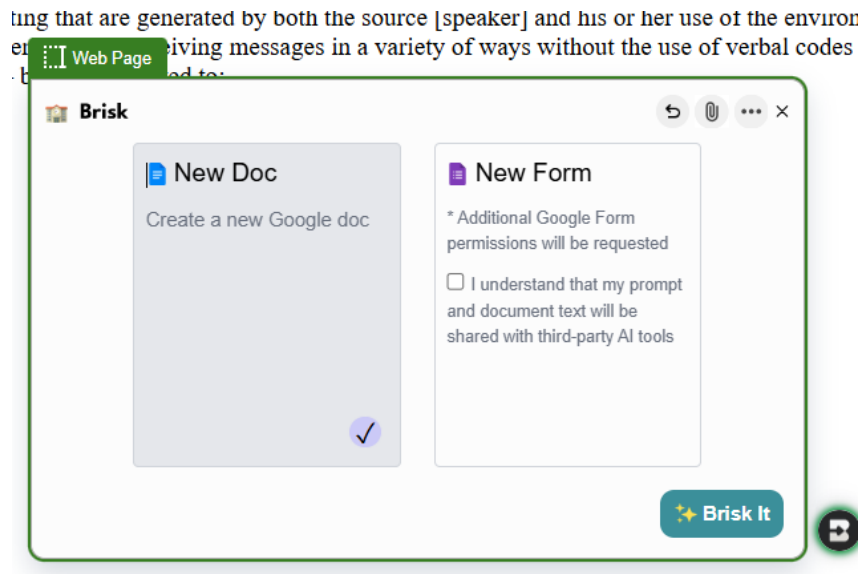
Choose Quiz from the Library box that appears:



The box to instruct Brisk to make a quiz will appear. If you want the answers to the quiz, you must add “and include a key” to the text box instructions. Choose grade level and number of questions. Click Next.



You can choose either New Document or New Google Form. I chose New Doc because I do not use Google Forms. Click Brisk It.



A quiz will generate with a key at the end. Download (File, Download, Microsoft Word) and adjust as needed. (I upload to Bookwidgets to make it interactive.)
