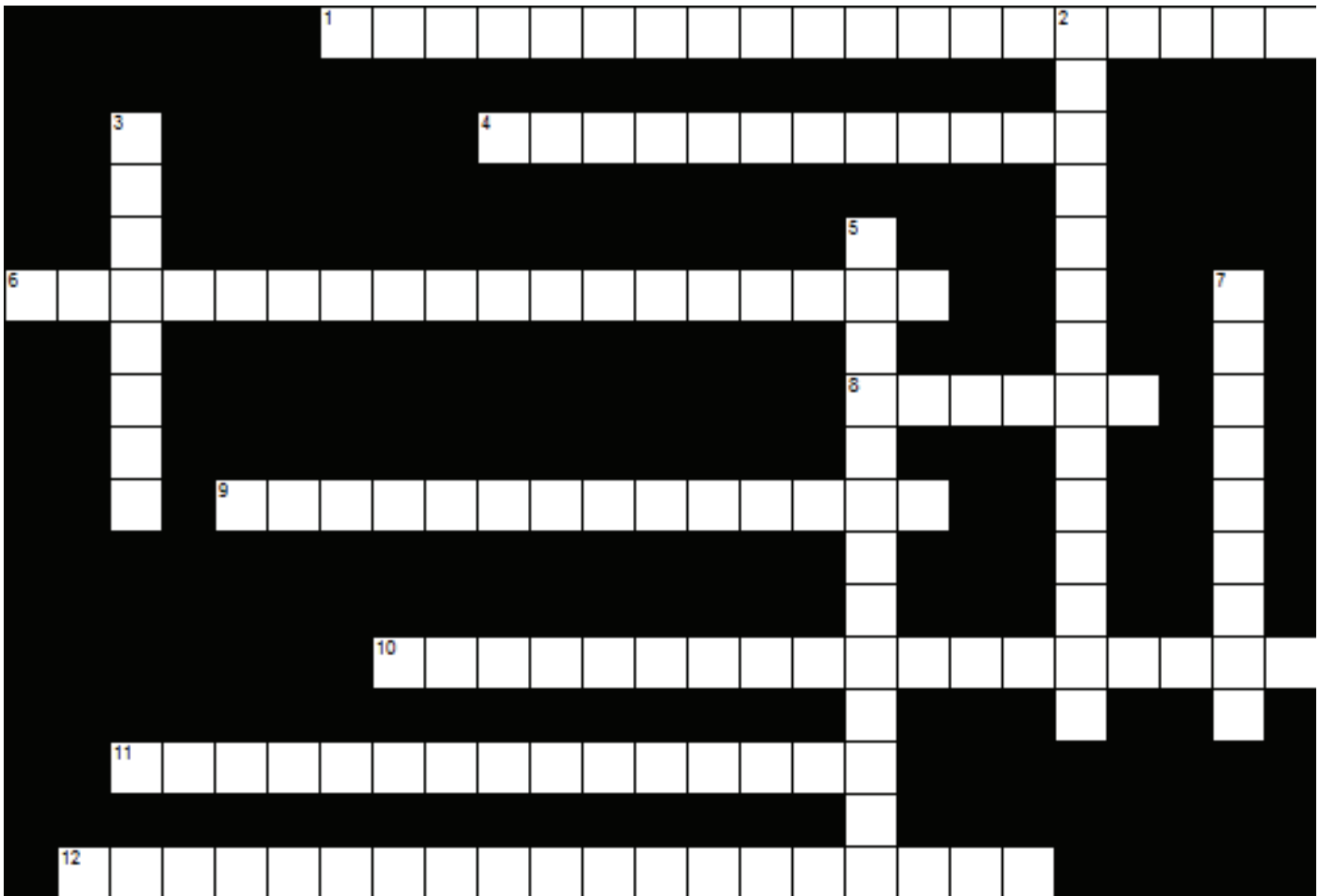


Organizational Structures



Across

1. Composed of self-contained units or divisions; builds on product departmentalization
4. Systematic grouping of individuals which have been brought together to accomplish a common goal
6. Occurs when a job is broken down into a number of steps which are each completed by a different individual
8. Organization that combines the elements of functional and product-based departmentalization creating a dual chain of command
9. The principle in which an employee should have only one supervisor to whom he or she is responsible
10. Produce an organization's goods and services

11. Non-elaborate structure that has little formalization and centralized authority
12. The grouping of individuals into departments based on work functions

Down

2. Occurs when only a select few people at the top of an organization make the decisions
3. Organizations that have developed a capacity to continuously adapt and change because members take an active role in identifying and resolving work-place issues
5. Sets an organization's goals and objectives
7. Structure that consists entirely of work groups and teams which perform an organization's work
